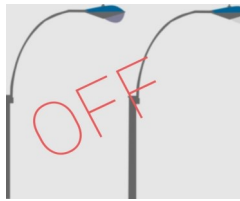


BUILDING PERMITS

Building permits

Is it time to replace those old windows or the shingles on your roof? Tired of looking at the same old kitchen and living room? If planning on improvements or remodeling soon, you may need to get yourself a building permit first. You can stop at the City Office at 121 Main Ave NE to pick up a building permit application, or you can visit our website at www.warroadmn.org and find it under Forms and Applications. Please allow 14 days for you application to be reviewed and issued.

STREET LIGHTS SHUT OFF

REMINDER: During most of the month of July, the street lights are off at night due to the fishfly population that comes to our region. To help keep the fishflies off your home, remember to turn off your porch lights in the evenings.



§ 94.38 OWNERS RESPONSIBLE FOR TRIMMING, REMOVAL AND THE LIKE.

All property owners within the corporate limits of the city shall be required and be financially responsible for the removal, cutting, or disposal and elimination of weeds, grasses and rank vegetation or other uncontrolled plant growth on their property, which at the time of notice, is in excess of 10 inches in average height, and in no event, exceeds 15 inches maximum height on at least 20% of the surface area of the property. Failure to do so will result in a \$150 charge to you if the City of Warroad has to mow your property.

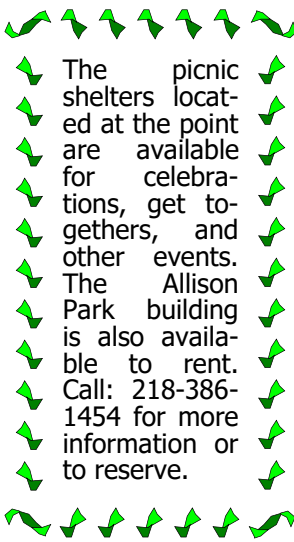

THUNDERSTORM SEASON IS HERE. IS YOUR HOME PREPARED? PROTECT YOUR HOME

Make a list of items outside your home you will need to tie down or put away so that they don't blow away or fly through a window during high winds. When a High Wind, Severe Thunderstorm, or Tornado Watch, is issued, immediately secure these items to avoid damage or injury once the wind starts picking up. Secure objects that would be unsafe to bring inside, such as gas grills and propane tanks. Trim or remove trees close enough to fall on your home. Keep drains, gutters, and downspouts clean. Find out if your home is prone to flooding. If it is, consider installing a sump pump with battery backup, and/or elevating the heating system, water heater, and electrical panel.

MOSQUITO SEASON IS HERE

Nothing takes the fun out of an evening barbecue outdoors like a bunch of bloodthirsty mosquitoes. You can keep your local mosquito population under control by limiting their habitat on your property. Adult mosquitoes lay eggs in stagnant or slow moving water, or on moist soil or leaf litter in areas likely to collect water. By eliminating these water sources, you can keep new generations of mosquitoes from taking up residence in your yard. Drill holes in the bottom, of any garbage or recycling containers stored outdoors.

Keep swimming pools cleaned and chlorinated, even when not in use. If you go on vacation without chlorinating your pool, you may return to a mosquito hatchery. Dump anything that holds water twice per week if it has rained. Birdbaths, non-chlorinated wading pools, garbage can lids, and pottery will all attract breeding mosquitoes. Remember to empty the saucers under your flower pots, and don't leave water in pet bowls for more than two days. Keep your property clean of items that can hold water, including discarded aluminum cans and tires.

The City of Warroad offers you multiple options to pay your utility bill. Online payment is available at www.warroadmn.org. We also offer the automatic payment plan, paying over the phone with a credit or debit card, using the drop box at the front of City Hall or paying in person. Please call the billing office at 218-386-1454 or stop by the City Hall office at 121 Main Ave NE for more information. REMINDER: Utility bills are due the 25th of every month. A late fee of 10% of the unpaid balance will be applied after the 25th and added to your balance due. This can add up fast! A \$350 past due balance will result in a \$35 late fee charge to your account.
