In addition to the state of Minnesota working on Hwy 11, this year the City of Warroad will be making improvements to a few of the streets in several parts of town. These areas will have mill & overlay done only. There are NO water/sewer service lines in need of construction this year. The following areas in Warroad will be “getting a facelift” this summer.... Hallberg St SW from Hwy 11 to gravel, Dale Ave SW from River to Hallberg St, Washington St SW from Hwy 11 to Dale Ave & Garfield St SW from Hwy 11 to Dale Ave and north on Dale for 1/2 block.

WARROAD DRINKING WATER CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT 2024

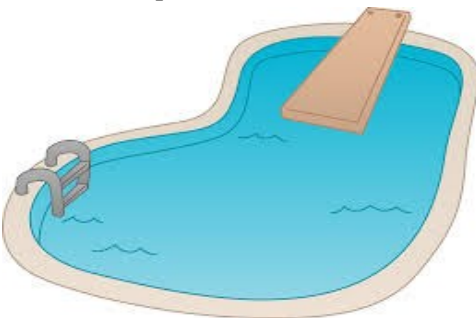
The annual Warroad drinking water consumer confidence report for 2024 is available to all Warroad residents. The CCR will not be published or mailed out, but is available at the following link:

IS YOUR HOME PREPARED?
PROTECT YOUR HOME**

Make a list of items outside your home you will need to tie down or put away so that they don't blow away or fly through a window during high winds. When a High Wind, Severe Thunderstorm, or Tornado Watch, is issued, immediately secure these items to avoid damage or injury once the wind starts picking up. Secure objects that would be unsafe to bring inside, such as gas grills and propane tanks. Trim or remove trees close enough to fall on your home. Keep drains, gutters, and downspouts clean. Find out if your home is prone to flooding. If it is, consider installing a sump pump with battery backup, and/or elevating the heating system, water heater, and electrical panel.

Where does Warroad gets its Power?

Founded in 1976, Northern Municipal Power Agency (NMPA) is the wholesale energy supplier for 12 participating municipal utilities located in eastern North Dakota and northwestern Minnesota. Headquartered in Thief River Falls, Minn., NMPA supplies the electric needs of more than 15,000 consumer meters in the same geographic area as the Minnkota member-owners. Minnkota and NMPA operate together in what is referred to as the Joint System. This arrangement, which has been in place since 1981, essentially combines the revenues, expenses and wholesale electric rates for the two power suppliers. NMPA owns a 30% share of the 427,000-kilowatt Coyote Station located near the town of Beulah in western North Dakota. NMPA also owns a load-ratio share (approximately 15%) of the Minnkota transmission system. Minnkota also serves as operating agent for NMPA.

We offer several ways for you to pay your utility bill

The City of Warroad offers you multiple options to pay your utility bill. Online payment is available at www.warroadmn.org. We also offer the automatic payment plan, paying over the phone with a credit or debit card, using the drop box at the front of City Hall or paying in person. Please call the billing office at 218-386-1454 or stop by the City Hall office at 121 Main Ave NE for more information. REMINDER: Utility bills are due the 25th of every month. A late fee of 10% of the unpaid balance will be applied after the 25th and added to your balance due. This can add up fast! A \$350 past due balance will result in a \$35 late fee charge to your account.
